Sponsored Programs

The Research Grants team (Office of Research) provides pre-award support and training to faculty in their pursuit of research funding* from Chinese and international sponsors.

- Identify and disseminate funding opportunities;
- Review and interpret sponsor guidelines for proposal preparation and submission;
- Facilitate the development of grant proposals;
- Coordinate internal review of proposals;
- Assist faculty with award acceptance and contracts signing with sponsors;
- Liaise with sponsors on administrative reporting (such as progress reporting and award close-out reporting).

The Research Grants team also coordinates with the Office of Sponsored Programs (OSP) at NYU Washington Square on faculty grants applied through NYU.

Human Subjects Research Protection

NYU Shanghai Institutional Review Board (IRB) is an independent administrative body to ensure compliance with relevant human subjects welfare regulations, policy, and guidelines concerning human subjects in research projects. The IRB has the authority to approve, require modifications in, or disapprove research involving human subjects activities (funded or unfunded) conducted by NYU Shanghai faculty and students.

The Human Subjects Research Protection team (Office of Research) supports the research community through:

- providing guidance to protocol submission requirements;
- coordinating protocol submissions and IRB reviews.

The team also facilitates the university's committee review of external requests for engaging NYU Shanghai students in research.
